BEFORE YOU JOIN US

EXAM ACCESS ARRANGEMENTS

If you had exam support at school, such as extra time or a reader, or if you think you may need support now, please let the Additional Learning Support (ALS) team or a teacher know.

We will assess and identify the support you need in line with your normal way of working in class in conjunction with your teacher, and will make arrangements for support to be put in place.

Our trained invigilators will assist you on the day of your exam.

ENHANCE YOUR LEARNING WITH IN-CLASS OR 1:1 SUPPORT

SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS WITH LEARNING OR PHYSICAL DISABILITIES (E.G. ASD)

Support for young people with learning disabilities or physical disabilities is **designed around your individual needs**, so no two support packages look the same. Information from school, parents and yourself help us to offer the right support for you.

SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS WITH COMPLEX NEEDS

We recognise that some young people may have more than one disability that affects their learning. The ALS team will work in a **multidisciplinary** way to ensure that support requirements are assessed and met where possible.





SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS WITH SPECIFIC LEARNING DIFFICULTIES (E.G. DYSLEXIA)

We have an excellent support service to help learners with specific learning difficulties, **including dyslexia and dyspraxia.** Our fully qualified assessors carry out many assessments each year to identify student strengths and areas of difficulty to ensure that you receive the support you need.

We support a large number of students each year who are enrolled on college courses. Support is delivered by our ALS Assistants and takes the form of one to one tutorials or in-class support.

The ALS team will liaise with you, your teachers and parents/carers to ensure you receive the right support to achieve your potential.

MEET KELL...



Before joining the college, Kell had limited school experience which caused him severe anxiety. He also has autism.

Through the support provided by ALS, **Kell passed all 5 of his GCSEs**, achieving 3 A grades, which led him to win the Principal's Award in 2016. Kell then progressed onto a Level 3 programme, studying BTEC Business, BTEC Games Development and A-level Sociology.

Kell achieved an outstanding A* in Sociology, as well as gaining four Distinction grades in his BTEC subjects.

Kell's exceptional achievement in Sociology led him to win the Award for Social and Political Science at our most recent Awards Evening. He is now studying Business Information Systems with a Year in Industry at the University of East Anglia.

MEET MACAULEY...



Macaulay was in receipt of an EHCP and required ALS support in all lessons when he first started college.

With the appropriate ALS support in place, **Macaulay passed** his Maths GCSE and BTEC Fast Track course, which allowed him to progress onto a Level 3 ICT Course. Macaulay overcame his nerves to attend university open days and decided to apply to the **University of Suffolk to study ICT**, for which he received an unconditional offer!

Macaulay's hard work and perseverance led to him **winning the Endurance Award at our annual Awards Evening.**
